Of course, none of this happens in a vacuum. It takes a collective. To our staff - you are the heartbeat of Homespace. Your resilience, your compassion, and your refusal to give up on our youth inspire me daily. 2024 was a year of growth for our services department! The team was able to accomplish many goals; including both individual and personal growth goals for our clients, and large, systemic goals for benefit of our programs overall.

In 2024, we had 4 graduates, 3 GED completions, and a resident graduated from Culinary School. These accomplishments were happily celebrated at a graduation party on Homespace property over the summer.

We also enhanced our relationship with the B-District police, the Chief of Police (Tommy Champion) and contracted with Security (Buffalo Special Investigations). All of these relationships contributed to client and staff's enhanced feelings of safety and security at Homespace, which was a top goal in 2024.

We grew our county contracts by 7! We added Dutchess County, Greene County, Jefferson County, Madison County, Steuben County, Tompkins County, and Wayne County. This sets Homespace up for a bright future of expanding our reach, and helping even more youth in New York State.

Lastly, we were proud to re-open our Next Step Group Home after revamping the program to include more structure, and a level system which has proven to be successful in compliance and client growth and satisfaction.

I look forward to more positive growth to come in 2025 and beyond.

## FROM THE DIRECTORS



### JULIE CORNELL, DIRECTOR OF HR/ADMIN



2024 was my first full year as Admin./HR Director and it was very busy from the start, learning my new role whilst managing a larger workload and finding my place among seasoned Directors. While challenging at first, I found both my groove and a team that fully supported me through the transition. Other well-deserved promotions in 2024 included Ainslie Evans moving to Clinical Supervisor of Behavioral Health, Chelsea Gabamonte increasing her duties and becoming our Administrative Coordinator, and Nicole Thelen moving into the role of Fiscal Manager. We also added a Nurse Practitioner in Psychiatry (PNP), a CASAC and a Tutor as Independent Contractors increasing services available to our clients.

Going into 2024, HR focused on employee engagement opportunities with staff input through survey. Our 2024 calendar of engagement included events like Dining w/the Directors, Valentine's crafts, a spring paint & pot, Juneteenth feast for the frontline staff, an end of school year party, a 90's themed Boat Ride in July, Homespace Day in August, a Halloween pumpkin painting in October, and in December the team collectively assisted Stephanie with our donations drive and helped to wrap gifts for our youth.

Still working through a DEI lens that began in 2023, I edited the employee handbook, looking for additional ways to improve the quality and inclusivity of candidates. Our goal was to adopt a "culture add" mindset when recruiting anywhere from top leadership to our frontline staff. Job Descriptions were reviewed, and with the support of the management team, we adopted a "skills and abilities" requirement in lieu of specific educational requirements. We made changes where we could (with positions that did not have OCFS regulations associated with education/licensure.)

After the 2nd Quarter Employee surveys returned following an incident that occurred in May, we were not surprised to see a slight dip in the work satisfaction scores of our employees. To address stress and burnout which were significant challenges with staff, we rolled out a new self-care promotion initiative to help alleviate some of those feelings where all frontline staff were entered into a drawing each month to win prizes related to self care. A winner was chosen for each category of employee to include one full-time/part-time YSS winner, one relief YSS winner, and one clinical winner; so 3 winners each month.

As the year progressed and the management team diligently worked to address safety, security issues and mental fatigue among staff, we ended the year with a positive outlook and with a 32.5% attrition rate; still below the national average of other similar agencies. Moving into 2025, we will continue to prioritize both our clients and staff, continue our DEI efforts, and look for more ways to increase engagement and satisfaction.

#### **Development**

In 2024, our development coordinator Stephanie Codd started her second year at Homespace, and was able to accomplish many tasks and goals with the collaboration and support of both the development committee and the management team, that fostered the long-term development and success of the agency, including:

- Our 30th Anniversary Celebration sold out, raised awareness for our mission, and surpassed fundraising goals - thank you to our sponsors!
- Homespace received 13 prestigious grant awards to assist us in various areas throughout the agency
- Development threw our 2nd Annual Mister Goodbar Fundraiser, which we plan to continue for many years
- Homespace began a rebranding project for a new logo, tagline, and mission to align with changes in foster care and our agency
- We enjoyed a successful holiday season with new fundraising highs, and ALL Homespace clients were "adopted" through the gifting drive; meaning they received Christmas gifts through our generous donors so every Homespace child had a Merry Christmas.

#### Maintenance

- Created training power points and revised policies and procedures for our new staff orientation

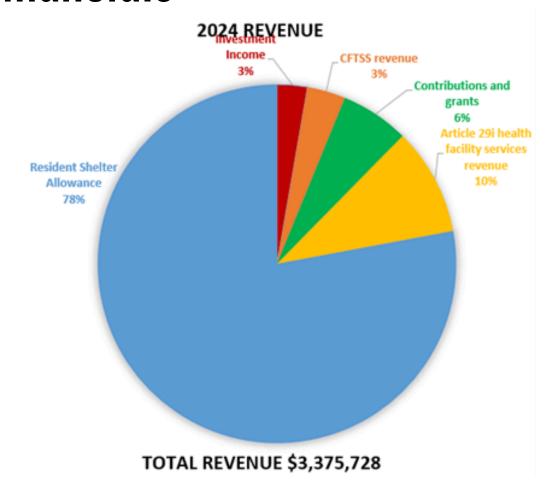
Additionally, I'm proud to say everyone on my team attended valuable DEI trainings through Clementine Gold Group.

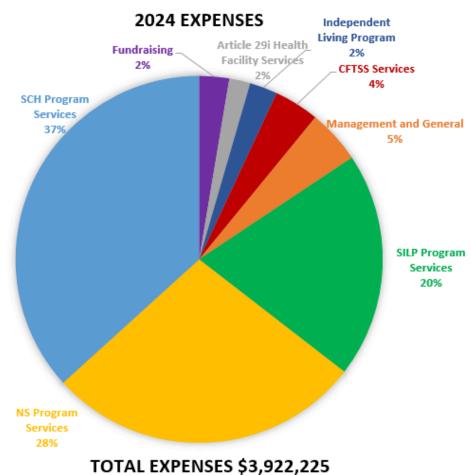
#### Medicaid 1115 waiver

The agency started preparations to become a community-based organization to provide Medicaid waiver services to eligible Medicaid members. Implementation will begin in 2025. The waiver focuses on health-related social needs; everyday things that people need to stay healthy. These include having enough food, a safe place to live, reliable transportation, and support for their care. If these needs are not met, it can make it difficult for someone to stay healthy. Below are the services we can screen for:

- Housing Assistance Such as rent and utility payments for up to six months.
- Food Security Such as consultations with a Registered Dietitian and shelf stable food packages.
- Transportation Support Such as rides to and from services, bus tokens, Uber rides, etc.
- Care Management Including navigation to eligible services for ongoing support.
- Screening and Navigation support.

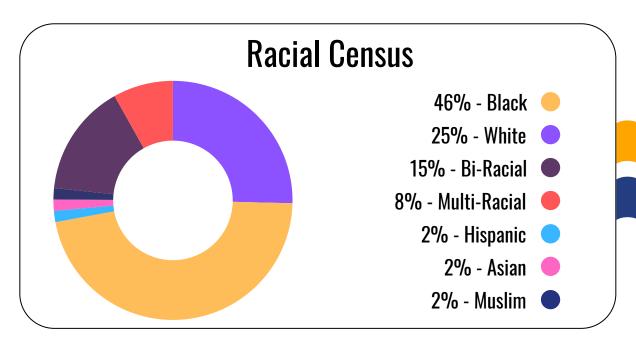


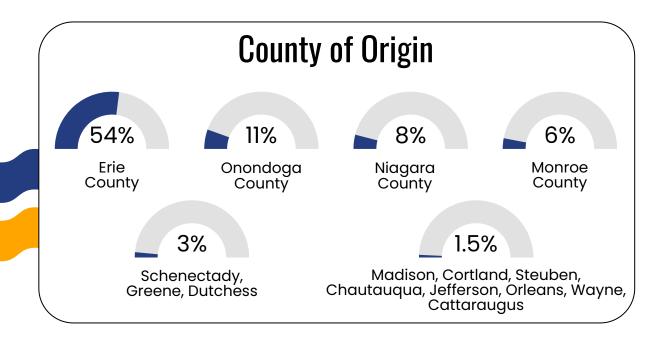
# Client Demographics
